WHAT THE AWARD INCLUDES

Successful applicants will be enrolled onto a Masters dissertation module and undertake their own health-related research project with support from their supervisor. You will work with a supervisor to develop the aims, questions and strategy of your dissertation. Options are available for start dates. WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

The UWE Personal Research Training Awards are for health or social care professionals (excluding doctors and dentists) who wish to develop careers that combine clinical research with continued clinical practice, and meet the eligibility criteria at the time of application for these schemes: NIHR Research career funding programmes, including registration with one of the following professional bodies: https://www.nihr.ac.uk/predoctoral-award-approved-regulatory-bodies. Also, applicants will be providers of services for one of the following Integrated Care Systems (ICS): Bath and North East Somerset, Swindon and Wiltshire Partnership, Healthier Together Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire and One Gloucestershire. We will consider applications from those outside these ICSs that have links to UWE (i.e. placement provider for UWE). You will have already completed accredited Masters level Research Methods module(s) and will be working towards completion of a Masters degree.

HOW TO APPLY

Applications for the award can be made by emailing a two-page CV (including relevant CPD) and letter of application to the address below. The letter should include a summary of completed, credited post-registration training and outline your reasons for applying, proposed health research dissertation topic and future research aspirations.
